New Scholarship Application (College-Bound Students)

IMPORTANT:

- Scholarship application with all items in the checklist must be submitted by **8PM on March 15, 2018**
 - Scholarship applications **must be complete** to be considered for review by the Committee
 - Scholarship process is **competitive** so a submitted application does not guarantee that an applicant receives an award
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ELIGIBILITY:

- Applicant must have passed two (2) consecutive Carlos Rosario School semesters
 - If currently in your 2nd semester, applicant must pass current semester
 - English Proficiency (*four possible ways to qualify – choose ONE*):
 - Applicant must have passed ESL 8
 - If a Career Academy student/graduate, applicant must have score of 70% on the TEAL Test
 - If a GED English graduate, applicant must have a Language Arts score of 146
 - If a GED Spanish graduate *without* ESL 8, applicant must have score of 70% on the TEAL Test
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CHECKLIST (Include all these items when you submit your application):

- Interview about education goals with Tatiana Ramirez– email tramirez@carlosrosario.org to schedule
- Completed Application Form
- GED (*English or Spanish*) Transcript, US High School Diploma, or Credential Evaluation report
- Proof of 75% class attendance during your last semester with Carlos Rosario School
- Proof of application/enrollment in higher education institution (*Community College or University*)
- Proof of application to FAFSA-Federal Student Aid (*if eligible*)
- Filled in financial worksheet (*see worksheet in packet*)
- Letter of recommendation from a current Carlos Rosario School teacher
- Letter of recommendation from your employer, friend, or professional contact
- Completed Essay #1: Describe how experiences from your life have prepared you for the program you want to study in college (*Tell us about your long-term career plan*). (500 words or more//typed essay)
- Completed Essay #2: What do you think is the most important challenge in your community and how have you worked in the past to solve that challenge (*Also explain how you plan use your education to solve the challenge in the future*). (250 words or more//typed essay)
- Submit all the documents above to the Student Transition Services
